Dr. Billie Jo Kipp is a clinical psychologist and a member of the Blackfeet Tribe. She is currently the associate director for research and evaluation for the Center for Native American Youth at the Aspen Institute. Dr. Kipp worked as a research associate at the University of New Mexico Center of Alcoholism, Substance Abuse and Addiction, and she assisted New Mexico's Head Start programs through her work as a local specialist for the Academy for Educational Development's American Indian Technical Assistance Network in Washington, DC. Dr. Kipp was selected by the American Psychological Association as Firsts: Women of Color Changemakers' national tour and is one of the top Native American leaders in higher education. Dr. Kipp's research and clinical experience has positioned her well as an expert in Native American health and wellness.

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
